Under the leadership of Founder and Chief Executive Officer Eva Moskowitz, the organization is at a pivotal and transformational moment in its accomplished history. Success Academy seeks a Principal Gifts Lead who will manage relationships with individual donors capable of making six-figure to eight-figure gifts to the organization. The ideal candidate will have genuine and unwavering passion for the scholars and shared values with Success Academy's dual mission.





### **Overview**

Success Academy Charter Schools (Success Academy) is redefining what's possible in public education. With 47 schools serving 20,000 students in Manhattan, Brooklyn, Queens, and the Bronx, Success Academy is delivering on its promises to provide the ladder for scholars to climb to fulfill their immeasurable potential. Success Academy empowers students to imagine a bright future and achieve it, delivering opportunity through an exceptional education, and speaks out against forces that stand in the way of every student attending to a top-notch public school.

Founded in 2006, Success Academy Charter Schools is the largest and highest-performing free, public charter school network in New York City. Admission is open to all New York State children, including those with special needs and English language learners. Students are admitted by a random lottery held each April. Success Academy operates 47 schools serving 20,000 students in Manhattan, Brooklyn, Queens, and the Bronx. Across the network, 78% of students are from low-income



households; 8.5% are current and former English Language Learners, and 15% are current and former special needs students. About 53% of Success Academy students are black, 30% are Latino, 7% white, 5% Asian, and 5% multiracial or other.

Authorized by the State University of New York's Charter School Institute, Success Academy schools are able to operate with greater independence than zoned schools but are held strictly accountable to the state for student performance. Every five years, charter schools are subject to reviews that determine if a school continues to operate.

Success Academy valorizes thinking and believes in learning by doing. Scholars learn best when they are engaged—grappling with challenging problems and discussing rich, complex texts. Success Academy pairs this approach with high expectations and accountability, setting a rigorous bar for effort, thinking, and work and consistently investing scholars in doing their best.

## Results

Success Academy is the size of the state's sixth-largest school district, serving 20,000 students across 47 schools. Of 7,405 students taking exams in 2019, 99% passed math, with 86% scoring at the highest level of 4, and 90% passed ELA, with 41% scoring a 4.

The 2019 test results demonstrate that children across all demographics — racial and economic, as well as those who have IEPs, are English Language Learners, or are experiencing homelessness — can achieve outstanding academic <u>results</u>. In all subgroups, Success Academy scholars outperformed their peers.



# Success Academy Education Institute

The Success Academy teaching and learning model, now tested and scaled across nearly 50 campuses, has proved extraordinarily effective. With scholars admitted by random lottery from many of New York City's poorest neighborhoods, Success Academy schools have achieved the highest standing in New York state.

Now, through <u>Education Institute</u>, Success Academy is providing open access to the broad architecture and singular components of the Success Academy model. Success Academy is sharing best practices,



resources, and training with educators across the nation to help many more children gain access to great schools.

## The Role
